| VARIETY CHARACTERISTICS: | Grand Perfection exhibits vigorous tops and root system. The shanks are long and upright, allowing for good neck protection from overhead irrigation and neck rot exposure. Bulbs are tall-globe shape with good skin color and a bright white interior color. |
