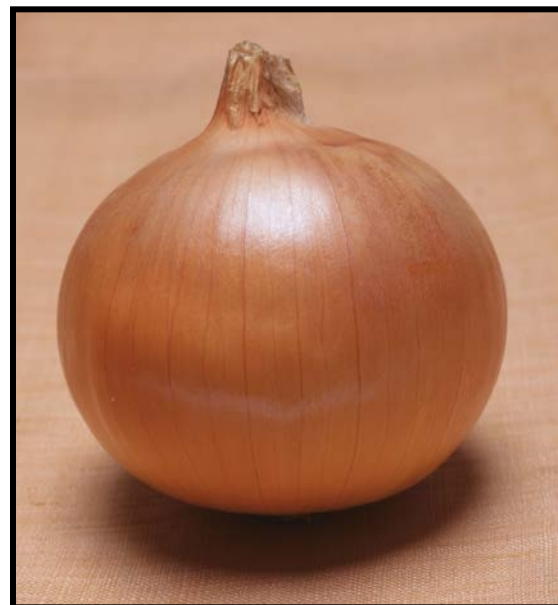


Hybrid Onion Trekker



DESCRIPTION: Long-day, storage type

MATURITY: Early- to mid-season maturity (95-100 days)

COMPARABLE VARIETIES: Hamlet, Nebula, Frontier, Mountaineer, Trailblazer

VARIETY CHARACTERISTICS: Trekker is very uniform. Globe shaped, extra-firm bulbs are covered with dark skin that has an attractive sheen. It is slow to bolt and will store until May under optimum conditions. Strong resistance to basal rot and neck rot.

MARKETS: Fresh market, also excellent for storage markets

ADAPTABILITY: Northeastern United States and Canada
